Dear Mr. Gallego:

The Agency is in receipt of your California Radioactive Material License and reciprocity fee.

Pursuant to Title 12, Chapter 1, Arizona Administrative Code; Article R12-1-320, "Licensing of Radioactive Material, Reciprocal Recognition of Licenses, you are hereby granted recognition of your California License No. CA 2105-30 for conducting activities using sources containing radioactive materials at temporary job sites in areas not under exclusive Federal jurisdiction throughout the State of Arizona.

In addition, notification to this Agency is required in writing three days prior to each entry into the state to conduct such activities. **Such notification shall include the location (townships, range and section), period, and type of proposed possession and use within the state.** If, for a specific case, the three-day period would impose an undue hardship on the company, you may, upon contacting the Agency, obtain permission to proceed sooner.

This authorization is for the periods of time and locations as specified in your letter of notification dated February 9, 2009 and shall not exceed 180 days in calendar year, 2009; and you may be inspected at any time. Additionally, your attention is directed to Article 4, "Standards for Protection Against Radiation"; Article 10, "Notices, Instructions and Reports to Workers; Inspections" and Article 12, "Administrative Sanctions" of the rules.

Also, be advised that the Agency is empowered to assess civil penalties for violations of the Agency's rules.

If at any time, you establish a permanent office or site in Arizona, or you wish to continue operations in excess of 180 days in any calendar year, you are required to apply for an Arizona Radioactive Materials License.
