Dear Mr. Gallego:

The Oregon Reciprocity License you applied for has been granted. The Oregon Rules for the Control of Radiation require you to notify Radiation Protection Services three working days in advance of your arrival to perform work in Oregon. Reciprocity activities may be performed a maximum of 30 consecutive days with a maximum of 180 days per year. For your convenience, a Notification of Entry form may be downloaded from <http://www.oregon.gov/DHS/ph/rps/docs/Reciprocity.pdf>. A copy of the completed notification form should be faxed to (971) 673-0553 each time you wish to conduct activities in the state under reciprocity.

Use of licensed radioactive materials in Oregon must be conducted in accordance with the conditions of your specific license issued by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission or an Agreement State, statements and representations made in your Notice of Entry, and the Oregon rules.

You will be inspected periodically by Radiation Protection Services. Failure to conduct your program safely and in accordance with documents cited above may result in enforcement action.
